It was the autumn of 2013, and members of Massachusetts Wing were invited to a staff ride at Minuteman National Historical Park. Frankly, at the time this writer had no idea what a military staff ride entailed. Reading up a bit, as a military history enthusiast, I just knew that I had to experience a battlefield tour.

L'American Revolution. As the British Empire imposed taxes on the colonists and impinged upon any form of self-government, the colonists of Massachusetts Bay became increasingly disenfranchised. The Boston Massacre, the Boston Tea Party, and Paul Revere's exploits (made famous by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem entitled *Paul Revere's Ride*) are part of the fabric of American History.

Participating in this staff ride was a unique experience. The instructor portrayed each battlefield's events from the perspective of the British and of the colonists. With the audience drawn in, a series of leadership questions ensued. Participants were encouraged to interact, discussing both leadership successes and leadership failures. I was hooked!



ast forward to the summer of 2014 at Camp Atterbury, Edinburgh, Indiana, a training center for Indiana's Army National Guard. A favorite haunt, I was serving at lead puble affairs officer (PAO) for CAP's National Emergency Services Academy. It was an extremely busy two-week stint. My responsibility was to take photos and write stories about CAP's communication, ground team, and air crew trraining schools, to name a few. While doing this, there were solders rappelling out of Blackhawks, A-10 Warthogs, zipping by, and an enormous stimulated chemical warfare attack scenario with mass casualites, etc.

That does this have to do with the rest of **V** the story, you are asking? Well, as I was closing the elevator door to go up to my room at the local Hilton Garden Inn, in walked U.S. Army Colonel Thomas Williams. He was the same gentleman who conducted the aforementioned staff ride! He greeted me politely and asked me to meet him at 1800 in the hotel's tiny courtyard. Arriving a few minutes early (as being late was NOT an option), I sat down at a table and waited with a wee bit of anxiety. Col Williams arrived, sat at the table, pointed to his ly twenty minutes to converse. Naturally chatty, this time constraint was novel and disconcerting. Precisely twenty minutes later, Col Williams stood up and wished me a good evening. I was astounded! Is this how the military operated at the executive level?

ast forward to April 2022. Now CAP Lt Col Williams (U.S. Army, Retired) conducted a more expansive staff ride in Lexington and Concord. It was a perfect day!. One steamy summer day at Joint Base Cape Cod during the 2022 MAWG encampment, he approached me with new idea. Why not bring cadet officers to Gettysbug National Historical Park for a staff ride watch, and indicated that we would have precise- on Veteran's Day? Why not? Done! Despite the drenching rain, cadet officers and senior members alike spent the day visiting five battlefields. We stayed at Carlisle Barracks, home of the U.S.

Army's War College. If you love history, you would be enamored of these historic buildings (on a side note, my room was alledgedly haunted!). It turns out that Carlise Barracks is a second home to our instructor, having conducted many staff rides for military officers at Gettysburg National HIstorical Park over several decades.

Lideas off of each other. His intellect and experience in conjunction with my cascade of ideas for cadet activities work well together. Leadership development and encampment training at the John F. Kenndy Presidential Library and Museum in January 2023 was a product of one of our many brainstorming sessions, as was a third staff ride conducted on April 22, 2023. There are so many innovative ways to teach leadership. My mind is spinning as I type.

For those of you going to the 2023 MAWG Encampment, be prepared to meet a gentleman who is gifed with wisdom, experience, and a "cut to the chase" attitude. As Commandant of Cadets, he will set the bar high in regards to expectations from cadet corps and staff members alike. We will all benefit from his style of leadership.





were advised to tour the museum, focusing on Ken-




